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## SUMMARY OF

#### NATIONAL PARKS & HISTORIC CITIES

The border of Texas and New Mexico is as good as it gets in the United States for authentic Mexican Food, Wild West culture, and beautiful sunsets. This trip begins in El Paso, Texas and twists and turns its way to Albuquerque, New Mexico. Before we begin, let's take a look at the three National Parks and two historic cities we will be visiting.

#### El Paso, Texas

Sitting on the border of Texas and New Mexico, this town is far from just an obscure Northern-Texas town. This once lawless town, is now a great spot to have some of the best Mexican food in the U.S., adventure out into the beautiful mountains and caverns, visit the local shops, and learn about the Tigua, a Native American reservation established in 1682.

#### **Guadalupe Mountain National Park**

Today, this hidden gem is a hiker's paradise but over 250 million years ago, it was a tropical coral reef. When the sea dried up, the earth pushed this reef upward and it resulted in the mesmerizing mountains that stand in this Texas town. This park is different than others you've visited. The majority of the park is primitive, and only a single parking lot at the Visitor's Center is as far as you can go by car. Everything else is by foot, and since this isn't one of the U.S.'s most visited parks, you'll be guaranteed a little solitude.

#### **Carlsbad Caverns National Park**

Crossing over into New Mexico you will find Carlsbad Caverns buried deep below the ground. Descending over 700 ft. you will journey through a series of caves that boast gorgeous stalactites and stalagmites and chandeliers. The good news is, you will only have to walk down the path into the caverns. Today, an elevator is at the bottom to bring visitor's back up to the surface. Once you get back to the top, see if you can spot the 400,000 Brazilian bats arise. Which may leave you thinking... were they hiding in the shadows of the caves WHILE we were down there? Spoiler Alert: the answer is yes!

#### White Sands National Park


Established as a National Park in only 2019, White Sands is one of the U.S.'s newest parks, and there is no where else in the world like this. Spanning 275 miles, these gypsum sand dunes are the largest in the world and can even be seen from space. This is really rare, because this crystalized sand typically dissolves in water, but since this area is so dry, these dunes have continued to grow strong and remain. Just a few miles away sits the White Sands Missile Range, the DoD's largest open-air range for missile testing.

#### Albuquerque, New Mexico

New Mexico's largest city, Albuquerque sits on top of a high desert and is the culture center for Indian Puebloan history in the U.S.. Touring the historical Old Town is a fun experience as the shops and restaurants are very unique. We will also be taking a hot air balloon ride; a tradition in this New Mexico town.

# Day 1: El Paso

#### **Texas**

After you land in El Paso, check in to your hotel or store your luggage at your hotel. From there, we will visit a few of our favorite places in this unique and exciting border-town.



#### **Ristramnn Chili Company**

Address: 2531 NM-28, Las Cruces, NM 88005

<u>Getting There</u>: This farm is approx. a 1 hour drive from downtown.

<u>Details</u>: Ristramnn is a working and functioning chili farm, where they grow, dry and sell beautiful (and hot!) chilies. A staple in the southwest cuisine, these chilis are packed with flavor. While you're visiting, you can tour the market where chilis are hanging from the ceilings to dry. Visit the gift shop to get some goods to bring home.

#### Visit Mexico and the World Famous Bar Kentucky

Address: 2Av. Benito Juárez 643, Centro, 32000 Cd Juárez, Chih., Mexico

<u>Getting There</u>: You read that right, this bar is located just over the Rio Grand River in El Paso's sister city, Ciudad Juárez, Mexico. The best way to get here is on foot, by crossing the pedestrian bridge at Paso del Norte.

<u>Details</u>: The World Famous Bar Kentucky gained notoriety during prohibition in the U.S in the 1920s. When the U.S. government passed the 18th Amendment to prohibit the sale of alcohol, producers in Kentucky moved their whiskey south to Mexico. After prohibition was repealed, many of these Kentucky companies moved back home. However, this bar remained. On July 4, 1944 someone poured a little tequila in with some Grand Marnier, added some lime juice and salted the rim. Just like that the Margarita was born.

Important: Please use caution and remain vigilant while crossing the border on foot. You must carry your U.S. Passport with you. Check with the U.S. Department of State on travel restrictions and warnings prior to your trip.



#### **Dead Beach Brewery** (open Thurs - Sat.)

Address: 406 Durango St, El Paso, TX 79901

<u>Details</u>: We love this brewery and never miss an opportunity to take a photo in front of the lit El Paso sign. They have a ton of beer on tap, great merch and live music. The tavern also offers great food and snacks.

#### **El Paso Brewing Company**

Address: 810 Texas Ave Suite B, El Paso, TX 79901

<u>Details</u>: This is another great spot for good drinks and even better food. Check out both breweries and let us know which one is your favorite!

#### **Frontera Churros**

<u>Details</u>: For a late night snack, check out the creative and delicious churros at Frontera. It closes most nights at 9PM, so don't miss it!



# Day 2: Guadalupe Mountains NP

#### **Box Coffee**

<u>Details</u>: Before you head out to Guadalupe Mountains, make sure to stop by this trendy and popular (for good reason!) coffee joint. The people who work here are just as great as the cup of coffee you'll get for your morning drive.

#### Recommended Time in the Park: 6 hours

#### **Getting to the Park**

Getting to Guadalupe Mountains National Park is relatively easy. The drive from El Paso, TX is a little less than 2 hours, and it's a straight shot across US-62 E. We will begin at the Pine Spring's Visitor's Center. Then we will drive to the McKittrick Canyon Visitor's Center for a second hike. Pack a lot of water, because this is a very primitive park, and refilling water bottles could be difficult.

#### **Inside the Park**

You can either park at the Visitor's Center for the Pinery hike or drive a bit further to the parking lot at the end of Pine Canyon Dr. for the other two hikes below. This National Park does not have any other roads open to vehicles. It is a true "hiker's paradise".

#### The Pinery (easy)

<u>Type</u>: Out and back

Length: 1 mile (30 minutes)

Elevation Gain: 78 ft.

<u>Starting Point</u>: Pine Springs Visitor Center <u>Details</u>:Located behind the Visitor's Center, this short hike will provide great views. This is a great option for those who are short on time and want a leisure walk.

#### <u>Guadalupe Peak Texas Highpoint Trail</u> (hard)

Type: Out and back

Length: 9 miles (5 hours, 45 minutes)

Elevation Gain: 1,982 ft.

Starting Point: Parking lot past Pine

Spring's Visitor's Center

<u>Details</u>: The trailhead is at the Northwest tip of the parking lot. This trail is only meant for those who have a good fitness level. Please make sure you are hydrated and carry multiple liters of water with you.



#### <u>Type</u>: Out and back <u>Length</u>: 3.6 miles (2 hours) <u>Elevation Gain</u>: 577 ft.

Starting Point: Parking lot past Pine

Devil's Hall Trail (moderate)

Spring's Visitor's Center lhead is at the Northwest

<u>Details</u>: The trailhead is at the Northwest tip of the parking lot. Please make sure you are hydrated and carry multiple liters of water.

# McKittrick Canyon to the Notch (moderate)

<u>Type</u>: Out and back
<u>Length</u>: 7.9 miles (4 hours)
<u>Elevation Gain</u>: 574 ft.
<u>Starting Point</u>: Parking lot past
McKittrick Canyon Visitor's Center
<u>Details</u>: This is a great trail and
offers really rewarding views. Make
sure to stay hydrated and bring lots
of water.



### Day 3: Carlsbad Caverns NP & White Sands NP

**New Mexico** 

Address to Pine Springs Visitor's Center: 727 Carlsbad Cavern Hwy, Carlsbad, NM 88220

Reservations are currently required to enter Carlsbad Caverns. Please visit <a href="recreation.gov">recreation.gov</a> to book the date and time of entry that you choose. No reservations are available on-site. Some areas of the cave are wet, so we recommend wearing closed toe shoes with good traction. The temperatures inside the caves can be cool, a light jacket is recommend at all times of the year. Please pay attention to the signs posted about food and drink. Water is permitted, but no flavored drinks or food is permitted inside the caves.

#### **Getting to the Park**

Driving to the park will take about 30-45 minutes depending on the location of your accommodations. When you arrive at the entrance gate, you will be required to show your self-guided tour ticket.

#### Inside the Park

There is plenty of parking at the Visitor's Center. From there, the trail is a short walk away. You will have the option to either hike or take the elevator in the Caverns. We recommend taking the Natural Entrance down and the elevator back up. The Natural Entrance is approx. 1.5 miles with a very steep incline (or decline). It is the equivalent of climbing a 75 story building.

#### **Natural Entrance Trail**

Type: One-way or out and back if you hike both directions.

Length: 1.5 mile (1 hour)

Elevation Gain: 750 ft.

Starting Point: 6 minute walk to the Northeast of the Visitor's Center.

Details: These are the footsteps of some of the first explorers of the Caverns. If you can, we highly recommend taking this entrance into the caverns. Don't worry - you won't have to walk up.

# SHORT HIKE

#### **Big Room Trail**

<u>Type</u>: Loop <u>Length</u>: 1.5 mile (1 hour, 30 minutes) <u>Elevation Gain:</u> 70 ft.

Starting Point: At the end of the Natural Entrance Trail or at the bottom of the Elevator.

Details: Take a journey in the dark and see if you can spot stalactites hanging tight to the ceiling and stalagmites growing mighty tall from the ground. Keep your eyes pealed for the bats that like to lurk in the shadows. At the end, take the elevator back up to the top.

#### **Sunset at White Sands National Park**

<u>Address</u>: 19955 US-70, Alamogordo, NM 88310 <u>Getting There</u>: The scenic drive from Carlsbad Caverns NP to White Sands NP will be worth the trip, including the sunset hike.

<u>Details</u>: When you arrive at the Visitor's Center, either rent or purchase a sled. You will most definitely want this while adventuring into the White Sand Dunes. The Visitor's Center closes around 5PM, so make sure you make it in time. Once you get your sled, follow Dunes Dr. in your car, and park at the White Sands Backcountry Trailhead.

# White Sands Backcountry Trail (easy)

Type: Loop
Length: 1.8 mile (1 hour)
Elevation Gain: 6 ft.
Starting Point: At the edge of the
parking lot
Details: If you feel like going a little
further in, check out this quick and
beautiful hike.

After you've left White Sands NP, drive to your accommodations in Ruidoso, NM (approx. 1 hour, 20 minutes)

# Day 4: Ruidoso & Albuquerque



We hope you had some time last night to enjoy a brewery or wine shop. Today, take some time to explore the old town, grab some coffee from Sacred Ground and enjoy lunch and a glass of wine at Enchanted Vine before heading to Albuquerque.

#### **Sacred Ground Coffee and Tea House**

Address: 2704 Sudderth Dr, Ruidoso, NM 88345

<u>Details</u>: The town of Ruidoso, NM is small and very special. Check out this cool cafe tucked away on a creek in the woods. Before you go, confirm the opening time by calling. Their hours never seem to be right on google maps.

#### **Enchanted Vine**

Address: 492 Fort Stanton Rd, Alto, NM 88312

<u>Details</u>: This location is the production facility for Noisy Water Winery and is a fun place to spend an early afternoon. Sit around the fire pits, listen to live music and taste some great wines... all "under the pines."

Once you're ready to leave Ruidoso, make you way to Albuquerque, NM (approx. 2 hours 30 minutes)

We hope you're staying at Los Poblanos, or somewhere equally as great close by. After you check into your accommodations, get ready for your sunset hot air balloon ride (offered seasonally). If you do this trip in the Summer, try a late afternoon sunset or even sunrise the next morning.

#### **Sunset Hot Air Balloon Ride**

<u>Details</u>: Follow the link above to check availability and book a flight that works best with your schedule. They will also send you all the necessary information for meeting points, arrival time etc.

<u>Duration</u>: These tours usually take approximately 4 hours round trip, with 45 minutes - 1 hour in flight.



#### **Dinner at Sawmill Market**

<u>Details</u>: There are so many great kitchens under one roof here at the Sawmill Market. You will easily find something for everyone.



#### **Brunch at Campo at Los Poblanos**

<u>Address</u>: 4803 Rio Grande Blvd NW, Los Ranchos De Albuquerque, NM 87107

<u>Details</u>: This place is fantastic! Enjoy a leisure brunch (try the LP Champagne Cocktails) before heading out to catch your flight. If you have time, take a walk among the Lavender and visit the farm shop for some great gifts to take home.
